When we began to work, back in 2004, we set the goal of organizing a World Congress that could go far beyond being a place to put forward breakthroughs, update subjects, encourage teaching and research. We decided to host a Congress for people to get to know each other, create bonds of friendship, generate trust, encourage integration of pediatric surgeons from all over the world as the best means to preserve and drive the progress of Pediatric Surgery.

In order to accomplish these objectives, we decided back then to:

- 1) Prioritize the scientific activity of the program and its excellence.
- 2) Promote discussions
- 3) Make a Congress economically affordable to most young surgeons, considering the different budgets in the countries that form the WOFAPS as well as the long distance to Buenos Aires.

The Congress organization is on its final stage. Scientific activity is guaranteed with a program that shall satisfy even the highest expectations. Apart from the Round Tables, the State of Art Lectures and the Pre-Congress courses that have already been announced, 349 works have been evaluated and accepted for oral presentations along with 295 posters.

It is now up to you, pediatric surgeons from every corner of the earth to come to Buenos Aires, work to be part of a great family, that allows us as a "family" no matter where, to

General Information / Información General

Climate

The country territory offers a wide variety of climates: subtropical in the North, sub-Antarctic in the southern Patagonia, and mild and humid in the Pampas plains. Media temperature from June to September is 12° C at night and 18° C daylight.

Language

Spanish is the official language of the Argentine Republic. In Buenos Aires, some lunfardo expressions -city slang- are used. Something to note is the use of *vos* (you) instead of the Spanish *tú* for informal treatment, and the use of *che* to address a person.

Che: this expression is used to attract a persons attention and allows addressing someone without using his or her name: Che, ¿me podés decir la hora (Che, could you tell me the time?). It expresses familiarity.

The porteños easily understand persons who speak Italian and Portuguese.

Currency

The official Argentine currency is the Peso. There are bills of 2, 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 pesos, and coins of 1 peso and 5, 10, 25, and 50 cents.

The U.S. Dollar is the most common foreign currency. Banks and currency exchange offices (casas de cambio), are places to exchange foreign currency, where you must present your passport.

Although the Dollar and Euro are generally accepted at shops and restaurants, we recommend using banks and other official exchange houses, to avoid possible frauds.

Clima

Moneda

La moneda oficial argentina es el peso. Hay billetes de 2, 5, 10, 20, 50 y 100 pesos y monedas de 1 peso y de 5, 10, 25 y 50 centavos.

Electric power in Argentina is 220 volt, 50-cycle alternating current.

Power outlets have 2 cylindrical holes or 2 flat holes with ground connection.

Telephone

Calling to Argentina from abroad, dial the country code 54 and then the area code of the place you want to call (Buenos Aires is 11). For domestic calls, dial 0 before the area code. For international calls, dial 00, the country code and city code.

Note that rates are reduced from 10.00 p.m. to 8.00 a.m.

Taxis

Taxis are easy to identify by its colors: yellow and black. It is not convenient to take them at the street. It is preferred to use radio-taxis calling to a company provided by the Hotel, shop, restaurant, etc.

Although US Dollars and Euros are generally taken everywhere, foreign currencies can be exchanged in banks and authorized bureaus. American Express, VISA, Diners and Master Card are widely accepted. There may be difficulties in changing traveler's check outside Buenos Aires.

Opening hours

Banks and Exchange Bureaus:

Mondays to Fridays from 10.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. Business Offices: generally from 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 p.m. and from 2.00 p.m. to 7.00 p.m.

Stores: in the big cities from 9.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m., although in the outskirts and the provinces they generally close at midday. Saturdays, from 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.

Cafés, cake shops and pizzerias: open most of the time except between 2.00 and 6.00 a.m.

Restaurants: lunch is served as from 12.30 p.m. and dinner as from 8.30 hours. Fast-food menus are served in many restaurants at all times.

Tips: 10% of the amount of the check is usually left in cafeterias and restaurants. Doormen, porters, and ushers in cinemas and theatres are also generally tipped.

El nombre Argentina procede del latín “*argentum*”, que significa plata. El origen de esta denominación se remonta a los viajes



voyages made by the Spanish conquerors to the Río de la Plata. The survivors of the shipwrecked expedition mounted by Juan Díaz de Solís found indigenous people in the region who gave them silver objects as presents. The news about the legendary Sierra del Plata - a mountain rich in silver - reached Spain around 1524. As from this date, the Portuguese named the river of Solís, Río de la Plata (River of Silver). Two years later the Spanish used the same name. The National Constitution adopted in 1853 included the name of República Argentina (Argentine Republic) among the official names to designate the government and the country's territory.

Location, area and frontiers

Located in South America, and thus, in the southern hemisphere, Argentina has an area of almost 3.8 million square kilometers, 2.8 on the continent approximately 54% are plains (grasslands and savannahs), 23%, plateaus, and the other 23%, mountains - and the remainder in the Antarctic. It is 3,800 Km. long and is located between latitude 22° and 55°. Its border with Uruguay, Brazil, Paraguay, Bolivia and Chile has a perimeter of 9,376 Km, while the territory bordered by the Atlantic Ocean is 4,725 Km long.

Religion

There is complete religious freedom in Argentina, although the official religion is Roman Catholic. Other religions practiced in the country are Protestant, Jewish, Muslim, Greek Orthodox, Russian Orthodox and others.
